



## **Fun in the Son's FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS**

### **Will my child be safe?**

Yes! All staff members are given safety training. All counselors are over the age of 18 and are fingerprinted and take part in a background check. Every child wears a camp shirt on field trips or a camp rash guard on water days to ensure visibility and distinguish us from other camps. Additionally on outings, children wear a CCYL Fun in the Son wristband with our phone number on it.

### **Can my child be in a group with their friends?**

Children choose their leader and are able to be with their friends if they are the same grade. Grades are grouped into 1-3 grade, 4-6 grade and 7-8 grade.

### **What is your staff to student ratio?**

Our ratio is one staff per ten students.

### **Will my child have fun?**

Yes! We understand the needs of working families. We have a heart to ensure that this summer camp is something to look forward to. Kids have a blast with like-minded friends and take part in plenty of fun field trips and on-site activities. On-site activities range from cooking fun (and healthy!) snacks, playing recreational games, following the nature trails to the nearby park, making crafts and building their faith with interactive Bible lessons. Oh, and did we mention they'll be tired at the end of their jam packed day?! They are always on the go. There will never be a dull moment--we promise you that!



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### **What hours are you open?**

We are open from 6:30am-6:00pm. We charge \$1 for every minute you are late to pick up.

### **How long will they be on the field trip?**

Typically, we depart from campus at 9am and return no later than 4pm. We will communicate with families through email and our [Fun in the Son Facebook page](#) about departure times for off campus activities.

### **Can myself or older siblings go on the trip with Fun in the Son?**

Unfortunately, we restrict Fun in the Son field trips to enrolled students only.

### **Who will remind my child to put on sunscreen?**

Each leader has sunscreen and helps apply it to their group. Sunscreen will be re-applied several times throughout the day.

### **My child cannot swim well. What will they do during pool days?**

Students take a swim test at the pool. Non-swimmers (and those who do not pass the test) are given a special wristband so they are easily identifiable and stay in the shallow section of the pool.
